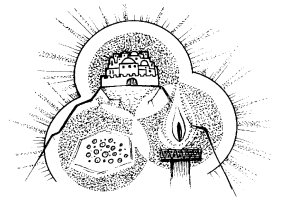

'The God who Speaks' Each week at mass we hear the three passages from the bible. Sometimes we might understand something of what they are about. And sometimes we possibly don't! During this year of 'The God who Speaks' we are seeking opportunities to take a closer look at the bible. Some events will occur in our partnership and in the diocese but, in the meantime, I am offering a *very basic introduction to the bible*. Rather than study in detail specific passages from the prophets or from the gospels this is an attempt to look at whole chunks of the bible at a time, to see how they fit together as part of a bigger picture. It is not an academic course but more of an opportunity to get something of 'the feel of the bible'. We had our first session last week; this was one where we took a jog through the entire bible in about an hour or so. Finchale Partnership Property & Community Review: In October 2019, we started a Property & Community Review, part of a Diocesan programme.
